## Resolution #8 - Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) Funding

WHEREAS, re-entry programming is a critical priority for the federal government and the states, and;

WHEREAS, substance abuse education and treatment are critical components of successful re-entry initiatives at both the institutional and community levels, and;

WHEREAS, each jurisdiction may have unique needs relative to the allocation of funds by type and length of program.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that A S C A supports full flexibility in the allocation and utilization of Residential Substance Abuse Treatment (RSAT) funds relative to the length and type of eligible substance abuse programming in institutional and community formats.
